Tips for Reporting Animal Cruelty

- 1.) Provide authorities with a concise, written, factual statement of what you observed.
- 2.) Record dates/times you witnessed the cruelties taking place.
- 3.) Photograph the abusive situation and date your pictures.
- 4.) Make a note of who you talk to when reporting cruelties.
- 5.) Follow up with the authorities, if you don't receive a response.

Did You Know?

- In the span of seven years, an unspayed cat and her offspring can produce 370,000 kittens.
- In the span of six years, an unspayed dog and her offspring can produce 67,000 puppies.
- Tragically, 4-6 million homeless and unwanted animals are euthanized annually because homes cannot be found.
- Virginia law requires all pets adopted from a rescue/humane organization or shelter be spayed/neutered.

- Reduces number of unwanted cats/kittens/dogs/puppies.
- Pets have less desire to roam.
